- 6 units for GCEcon Core Courses

If Exemptions apply for Core courses, students are to undertake replacement Elective courses. With Head of School approval, a student may include 2 units for a level 7 course towards Electives.

The following is a suggested study plan only. There may be other ways to plan your progression through this program.

A study plan ensures pre-requisite courses are completed first. Students should not attempt courses where they have not completed the UQ pre-requisite(s) or an alternative comparable course completed at undergraduate or postgraduate level.
