

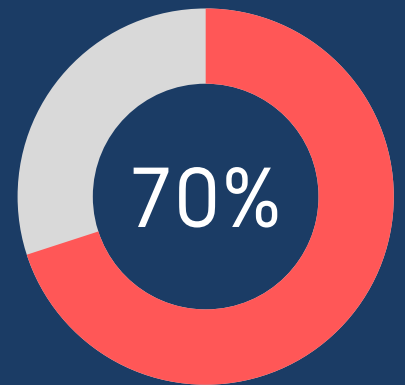
A GREEN BRISBANE: LOW EMISSION ZONES

WHAT IS A LOW EMISSION ZONE?

A Low Emission Zone (LEZ) is a designated area where access is regulated based on the emissions produced by vehicles. If a vehicle is considered a heavy polluter, the owner will be charged a daily fee to use the area where the LEZ is applicable.

WHY LOW EMISSION ZONES?

Motor vehicles contribute to over 70% of Brisbane's total emissions, and with the number of vehicles on the road increasing, we are **falling behind** other Australian cities and the national guidelines for pollution.



Air pollution is associated with increased:

respiratory and cardiovascular diseases

reduced lung volumes in children

increase in daily deaths and stroke risks

DANGERS OF EMISSIONS?



Latest research shows that vehicle emissions in Australia may cause:

BENEFITS OF LOW EMISSION ZONES?

WHAT IS OUR STRATEGY?

Brisbane's LEZ will be first implemented in **Rocklea, Brisbane CBD and South Brisbane** - Brisbane's most polluted areas according to Air Quality Index (AQI) metrics.

Based on London's daily charges, which created over **\$420 million** in revenue, non-compliant vehicles in the LEZ will be charged **\$24 a day** - this revenue will be spent on local transport networks.

In conjunction with Queensland's Zero Emission Vehicle Strategy - a rebate of **\$6,000** will be provided to households that earn less than \$180,000 per year to help purchase greener vehicles.
