PROGRAM GUIDELINES

Complete 16 units comprising:

- 14 units for all GDipEcon Core Courses, and
- 2 units from GDipEcon Program Elective Courses (consisting ECON7*** courses)

ECON7002 is not included and not permitted as an elective course towards the GDipEcon program.

If Exemptions apply for Core courses, students are to undertake replacement Program Elective courses.

The following is a suggested study plan only. There may be other ways to plan your progression through this program if you have exemptions from any core course(s).

The study plan ensures pre-requisite courses are completed first. Students should not attempt courses where they have not completed the UQ pre-requisite(s) or an alternative comparable course completed at undergraduate or postgraduate level.

Not all elective courses are offered every semester and/or every year. Check courses offerings prior to enrolling.

Students may progress through the GDipEcon potentially with full credit to one of the School's single (32 unit) Master programs. Careful course selection is necessary especially where Exemptions may be applicable:
